

JAGUAR LEAPS BACK ON BONNET

JAGUAR'S jumping cat is back. After 35 years in the wilderness, the famous Leaper – the brand's trademark Jaguar symbol – has returned to the bonnets of new Jaguars sold in Australia.

Every X-Type, S-Type and XJ built from last month for the Australian market now has the spring-loaded cat perched above the grill.

The Leaper fell victim to the strict Australian Design Rules relating to pedestrian safety, and the 420G, which was replaced by the XJ6 in 1970,



became the last Jaguar with the emblem to be sold in Australia.

However, Jaguar Australia general manager David Blackhall's return from a five-year stint in the United States was the catalyst, pun intended, for the Leaper's return.

"I'd been driving Jaguars in the States and they always had a pedestrian-conscious, spring-loaded Leaper," Blackhall says.

"When I got back here I told the team I thought it was an iconic representation of the brand, and people who buy these cars like those kinds of things.

"It got dropped for safety reasons (in Australia), and fair enough, but I knew the spring-loaded ones fitted in the States would pass design rules here," he says.

"We talked to the Government, they came back and told us it fully complied with all rules. The reality is, though, if you were hit by a Leaper you'd be in a lot of trouble anyway, because it's a fair way back on the bonnet."

The emblem has been sold continuously in the US and other countries, though not in Britain, which, ironically, remains Leaper-free.

Jags destined for Australia are now being fitted with the bonnet designed for the US market (previously, Aussie Jaguars were fitted with the British-style bonnet). This style of bonnet is designed to collapse to protect pedestrians and the Leaper.

But the Leaper won't be fitted to the XK sports coupe because it doesn't lend itself to the car's sleek shape, he says.

The way in which the Leaper is attached to the bonnet makes it difficult to break off or steal.

"If you were really determined you could pull it off, but with bare hands it's a bit of a challenge.

"Before the Melbourne Motor Show we had a good go at it to see if people could break them off and nick them. We didn't lose any at the show.

"The response (to the Leaper) at the motor show was quite staggering. I saw people getting photographed with the Leaper, playing with the spring-loading mechanism.

"The owners' clubs love it too. We made presentations to them last year and pre-warned them about it, and they've been very supportive of the idea," Blackhall says.

He says the emblem's return has been greeted enthusiastically by Jaguar's band of brand loyalists.

"It's a unique thing. We hear from our customers part of the reason they're buying a Jaguar is because they don't want just another BMW or Benz."
