## JAGUAR SEES THE LIGHT

The next XK coupe was unveiled with great fanfare at this week's Detroit motor show, reports JOSHUA DOWLING.



Jaguar calls it an Advanced Lightweight Coupe but despite all its technical innovation, it's possibly the most authentic Jaguar concept car yet, even though the British brand has been owned by US giant Ford for more than a decade.

As the sleek coupe was carefully driven onto the main stage of the Detroit motor show's Cobo Hall, in a Hollywood-style introduction with smoke, lights and loud music, it rumbled into view ... with just one headlight working.



Charismatic Scotsman and Jaguar's chief designer Ian Callum (better known to Australians for his work as a designer of Holden Special Vehicles) either didn't notice or carefully avoided the issue as he walked around the car, nursing a broken collarbone from an earlier mishap.

"This car represents the very essence of Jaguar, its heart and soul. If you want to know what direction we're going to take, this

is our answer," waxed Callum, apparently oblivious to the car's sole working headlight as the vehicle spun slowly on a turntable so the packed arena could see it. "Even standing still, it's poised to move."

Callum's boss, Jaguar chief Joe Greenwell, also may not have appreciated the irony in his speech when he said the car was "true to our past". In the 1980s, when Britishowned and made, the brand's vehicles were notoriously unreliable and poorly built.

Greenwell said the concept coupe would lead Jaguar into a new era of smarter and sharper design. For some time now the brand has been criticised because its new models too closely resembled the old.

With massive job losses, financial losses and sales losses, Jaguar had a forgettable year in 2004 and the company was trying to cast a shiny outlook.

"We had some significant challenges but we faced up to them," Greenwell said. "It's no quick fix and we have a plan to turn Jaguar around."



Officially, the Advanced Coupe Concept is a "design study", car talk for "we're going to build it but we don't want to tell you yet in case it brings sales of the current model to a halt as buyers wait for the new one".

Unofficially, it's the long-awaited replacement for the XK coupe and it will be on sale in the US early next year and Australia by the end of 2006.

The show car was powered by a supercharged 4.2-litre V8 but Jaguar did not release any technical details. A welcome highlight of the car was the much improved interior layout. Gone are the fussy and fiddly toggle switches and the mish-mash of buttons; they've been replaced with a dial and a couple of well-placed buttons in a much cleaner and more open layout. These photos show a largely finished design. Note the sharp creases on the rear wheel arches to give the car a "powerful appearance". Drive understands the sheetmetal has been finalised and minor changes only are expected to front and rear bumpers.

## **BIG CAT CAUGHT SLEEPING**



The current Jaguar XK coupe was released in 1996 and has received minor revisions throughout its life cycle, the most recent of which was in March last year. Just 721 XKs have been sold in Australia over the past eight years, making it rarer than a Porsche 911, according to sales figures compiled by the Federal Chamber of Autmotive Industries. Sales peaked in 1998 with 140 XK-8s leaving showrooms but slowed to a trickle of just

30 last year, when the car cost between \$188,000 and \$237,000. In 2003, when the XK played paid-for cameo roles in James Bond and Austin Powers movies, just 47 XKs were sold locally.

## COMPANY CARS ARE BETTER THAN REGULAR CARS BECAUSE...

- 1. They travel faster in all gears, especially reverse.
- 2. They accelerate at a phenomenal rate.

- 16. No security is needed. They may be left anywhere, unlocked, with the keys in the ignition.
- 17. They have special batteries that can be drained and jumped repeatedly without damaging the electrical system.
- 18. They come with "temporary" spares that are good for 50,000 miles.
- 19. They have specially reinforced bumpers for moving annoying objects, such as shopping carts and sub-compact cars in parking lots.
- 20. All repairs can be accomplished with the cheapest after-market parts available.
- 21. Parking brakes do not need to be dis-engaged to drive.
- 22. When parking on a hill, it is safe to leave it gear and ignore the parking brake.
- 23. The upholstery is impervious to stains, burns, and makeup.
- 24. They are easily parked in spaces intended for much smaller cars.
- 25. They are bullet-proof, so you can be as obnoxious behind the wheel as you want to be.


