


The minutes of the previous meeting held on 6 September 2006, having been previously distributed, were taken as read and were confirmed.





For millennia, jaguars have served as potent cultural icons for many indigenous American people from the Mayans and Incas, to the Guaraní Indians of the Gran Chaco. The Maya believed the jaguar's skin symbolized the night sky, while the Aztecs fed the hearts of sacrificial victims to the big cats. Among Amazonian societies, the jaguar, with its shining, reflective eyes, were thought to connect to the spirit world.



Today, Jaguars remain an important symbol in many religious and artistic expressions in the New World. However, there is a growing conflict between those that would honour the jaguar for its spiritual, cultural and ecological significance with those that continue to cause its decline.
