FELS JAGUAR JAUNT TO THE NATIONAL RALLY IN ADELAIDE. Jan Fels



Just Reg and I set off for Adelaide on April 2nd. Originally there were going to be 3 other couples coming with us. Frank Munis was told he could have his operation for his knees, so there was no stopping him and he and Glenys set off for Brisbane. Then Craig and Virginia couldn't find a babysitter to look after their horses and dogs, plus hundreds of peacocks!!!!. Finally Dick and Anne were unable to come because of work commitments. So that left Reg & me. I should say now we missed you all, as our Adelaide friends, except for one couple, were not the most welcoming of people, but that's another story.

We left our friends babysitting our home for a month and headed out to Charters Towers. Then turned left on to the Gregory Development road. The start of that road was very narrow but work is in progress and soon it will be as good as the rest of this highway. We made Injune that night, as there was very little traffic.

That night we paid for our accommodation, as we wanted to be on the road early the next day. I wanted to stop in Burra on our way down to Adelaide. It is such a pretty place and has unique shops.
