and cool sitting on their front verandah,



The volunteer curator Peter Richardson gave us an exhaustive tour of the museum housed in mining magnate John Moffat's old residence. I can remember just some snippets.





were destroyed during WW2 so that enemy aircraft could not use them to navigate. Railways were built to remote places mainly by Moffat but due to difficult terrain goods were also transported by mules - not horses. Mules could carry their load to half body weight whereas horse could carry only half again. Cross-breeding of mules with Clydesdales produced Jumbo who successfully carried an enormous winch capstan used in the shaft of the biggest mine. He was also very smart and could

be sent alone to remote camps to bring back food for mine workers and animals. John Moffatt was very generous to his workers and at the completion of one rail spur-line he gave workers and families a Sunday ride to the end of the track and a five star banquet complete with white table cloths and all. Pity the bosses are no longer as generous these days.



I suggested to Peter that after a full afternoon recounting the history of the district that he quenches his well earned thirst at the local and he did agree. The long and winding rocky road to Irvinebank was worth it and worthy of a revisit but not in the Jag next time. Dick did say the road was good but it sure wasn't perfect!
