KARUMBA WEEKEND

About 8:00am on Friday 31st August we set out from Mount Isa in the XJS for Karumba where we hadn't been for 25 years. We had planned on taking the E Type but with temperatures getting up into the 30s we decided the XJS would be much more comfortable. The drive through the hills to Cloncurry was spectacular with the morning sun changing the colours of the hills and grasses. We topped up with fuel at Cloncurry and set off to our next stop at the Burke & Wills Roadhouse. The road was surprisingly good as we had heard reports of a lot of loose stones on the road but this was not so. Not a lot of traffic, a few triple road trains and of course the inevitable 4WDs and caravans. We had an excellent lunch at the Burke & Wills, Franks hamburger with the lot was huge, with a full size rissole instead of the usual hamburger patty. No stone damage so far but Frank had taken the precaution of fitting headlight protectors to the XJS before we left.

The road from the Burke & Wills to Normanton was very good in most sections but there were several kms of narrow bitumen with fairly high shoulders which we coped with oncoming traffic by slowing right down, getting off the bitumen and stopping, letting the traffic stay on the narrow bitumen. Would you believe there was still the odd 4WD that insisted on having two wheels on the road and two in the dirt and stones and not slowing down one iota!!! Through Normanton and on to Karumba, reaching there about 3:00pm. We checked into our motel which was situated right on the point looking straight out to the mouth of the Norman River and the Gulf. The "End of the Road Motel" is only about 2 years old with very spacious room and huge undercover parking. The rooms are fully equipped with all crockery, cooking utensils, microwave, cooktop, frypan, toaster etc as they do not have a restaurant as the Sunset Tavern is right next door. They also do not serve breakfasts but have an arrangement with Ashs across the road where breakfasts can be ordered and are delivered from their café. Everything is very casual, the owner/managers attire is stubby shorts, singlet and occasionally thongs.

We were lucky enough to be able to book on the Croc and Crab sunset cruise that evening which is run on demand. The boat can carry up to 25 people and was powered by two 250 Yamaha outboards, very smooth. We set off about 5:00pm down the Norman River and were lucky enough to see a 13 ft croc basking on the bank. (Frank reckons it is either an inflatable croc or it is tethered there). We cruised back up the river to the Gulf and were regaled with as many prawns as we could eat, bottles of red or white wines and wine glasses etched with Croc and Crab which we got to take home with us. We cruised around and watched the sun go down on the ocean which would be spectacular in the wet season and finally got back at about 7:00pm. Well worth it!!

Saturday was a very lazy day. We drove around the town which is really in three parts, the point where we were staying, about 3 kms to the town itself which is not large and then further out to the port area where cattle are loaded for live export and of course the Century Mine Zinifex complex for the export of zinc which is carried by a slurry pipeline from the mine, dried and loaded onto the barge which then takes it out to sea where the zinc is transferred to the ship. Karumba is very much a fishing town as there appeared to be a boat of some description in every front yard.

We feasted again on prawns which we had purchased from Raptis' outlet with fresh bread from the bakery and a Caesar salad from the Sunset Tavern, this is living!!! We sat outside overlooking the sea in candlelight (as the power was out) with the odd bottle of red until about 10:00pm.

We left Karumba on Sunday and cruised back to the Isa, again stopping at the Burke & Wills for their massive hamburgers for lunch. Very little traffic on the road and no stone damage to the car. A very pleasant weekend which we would recommend to anyone with a few days to spare.
