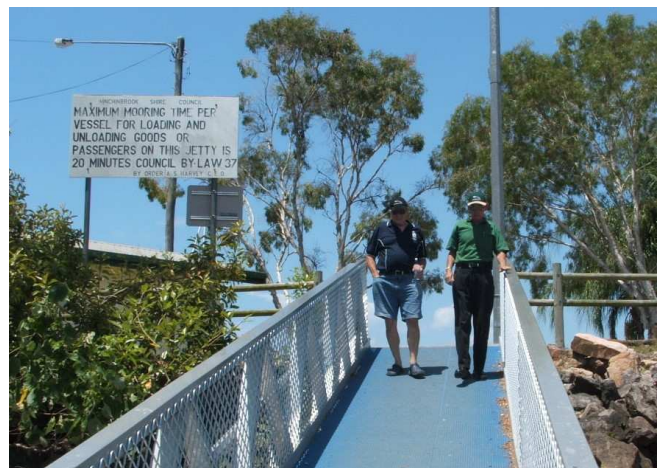
Hinchinbrook Marine Cove (or Dungeness in other words).
