





Technical Matters

Russell Botha in Julatten has just finished a complete restoration of the independent rear suspension on his 1983 XJS. He has been keeping me updated on his progress, which seems to have gone far smoother than it did for me when I went through severe angst with my irs last year, despite the problems he encountered with his Dana differential. Maybe this has something to do with him actually fixing and restoring cars (Land Rovers and Jaguars) for a living!

(It seems that Dana differentials were used on some XJS models between about 1983 and 1986. Cars equipped with Dana diffs use different rear brake rotors due to the fact that the rear brake calipers mount to the differential in a slightly different way.)





Russell is meticulous, as can be seen on the left, which shows one rebuilt brake caliper and a partially reassembled irs.

And on the right is the finished unit ready to be reinstalled.

Next step is to instal a new under-carriage, stainless steel exhaust system which he has designed and will build himself.

I've known Russel for 12 years now, and I've never known him to sell a car – he currently has 7 registered vehicles, and many more unregistered. Pity!

Can't wait to see your car back on the road.





An XK8 Story.....

Part 2 (following on from last month's magazine)

The JTIS program is essentially the factory service manual in electronic format. I have downloaded this, and use it extensively, along with various Jaguar forums, and a whole host of online parts suppliers, to identify what various parts my car consists of, and to get to the bottom of defects or removals etc. This program is applicable to the later XJ-S, XJ Range, XK's, S-Type and X-Type cars - and I'm happy to help anyone install, use and interpret the JTIS.

Cruise contro

My latest project is the fitment of an OEM cruise control system. Fortunately all XK8's had a standard wiring loom, hence the fitting of this system only needs the components attached to the car.

I have since purchased all the necessary components required from eBay for quite reasonable money and now in the process of fitting them. This is a vacuum controlled system, consisting of two vacuum tanks in the right hand front wheel arch, additional steering wheel switches, a master switch and piping to the throttle body actuator. I now have this 90% complete and looking forward to completing this project, hopefully in time for the next club day trip.

Timing Chains

The AJ-26(V8) engine is notorious for failure of the camshaft chain tensioners. The original tensioner design has a plastic body, and over time, this fails due to heat from oil under pressure, rendering it unable to maintain chain tension. Along with the fibre followers cracking, this requires a major strip of the front end of the engine. I not sure if the tensioners on my car have been changed yet, but going on the original water pump, I suspect not. I now have all the seals required to remove a cam cover to see if they have been changed. There are four tensioners, two for the primary chains and two for the secondary chains. These engines have variable valve timing, actuated through the secondary chain and sprocket, which constantly varies cam lift with changes in load & RPM. This adds additional stress on the secondary chains and so it's important to have this done if required. I need to purchase some tooling for this job, but would appreciate a loan of the tools if anyone has them in the club.

Future Project: fitment of 'JagWrangler' Real Gauge

The XK8 oil pressure gauge looks like an oil pressure gauge, but is only a pressure switch, activated at 10psi, extinguishing the red light and sending the needle to the centre position. The temperature gauge works in a similar fashion. This modification converts the switch gauges into fully reactive gauges, progressively indicating oil pressure and water temperature.

Radio/Cassette

The radio backlighting doesn't work well and needs to be fixed, and I'd like to fit a Bluetooth music/telephone kit. This old girl shows some age in comparison to modern cars, but the quality of sound is very impressive

Water under floor

I purchased this car from Sydney and decided to have it transported to Townsville, rather than driving it for two days myself. This worked out more economical, except they snapped the handbrake cable. However, it was a blessing in disguise - as while in the process replacing this cable, I also discovered the air-con evaporator drain was leaking into the car. Instead of water draining down the rubber drains from the evaporator and on to the floor, it was draining internally. This hadn't caused any major corrosion at this stage, as the previous owner never used the air-con while in the UK! So, during my short time of using the car and awaiting the delivery of the new cable, the water had pooled. If left un-noticed, it would have led to damp smells and then corrosion....... a nightmare. Replacing the drain hoses required the removal of the centre console, then some acrobatics.......but wasn't too bad and I now take great delight in seeing water dripping on my garage floor...!!

Front suspension

There was a disconcerting knocking noise which turned out to be coming from the front left strut bump stop. At the same time, I replaced the top mount and bottom shock absorber spherical bearing. This is a relatively simple job, but required some spring compressors and of course time. Being summer, it also subjected me to some heat stress – in future I will try to keep these jobs for the winter months.......if there is such a thing in Townsville!

Service

I carried out a full service, plus changed the accessory drive belt, tensioner and idler. The idler was intermittently noisy, but now all is quiet and good. I decided to use fully synthetic oil, and chose Castrol Edge. I'm hoping it will give the engine greater protection, especially in summer and minimise engine issues. Being such a tight fit in the engine bay, these engines run very, very hot and sadly the XK8 wasn't fitted with much needed bonnet vents/grills.

Wheels

Being an ex UK car, the wheels have suffered a little corrosion under the lacquer on the inner surfaces and some minor 'gutter rash'. These were refurbished by Jordan at the 'Mag Medic', who performed a very professional job, and my wheels now look like new. I'd strongly recommend Jordan, who interestingly is an ex Jaguar/Land Rover/Aston Martin UK. A very skilful and professional tradesman.

Remote controlled electric windows

By fluke, I stumbled upon a person selling a 'JagWrangler' remote control kit last year, to operate my car's electric windows using the remote control unit. This mod kit, is designed and sold by The JagWrangler in the USA, who are specialists in electronic mod kits for Jaguars. They sell these kits which can be wired in to operate the soft-top on the XK8/R convertible or the electric windows on the Coupe. These kits come with everything, and have excellent fitting instructions and email support. I fitted this one Saturday afternoon and it has been is 100% reliable since. Check his web site out........ 
