A worthy winner.




Most Improved Car 2017

Technical Matters

The Shame of it! Nigel Miller

Since our last club outing to Mingele for lunch, I've suffered the ignominy of having 3 Jaguars and not ONE on the road, after the "S" Type developed a short in the indicator/brake light circuit!@. As of today (27th November) though, that situation appears to have corrected itself – the XJS is now back in commission.

The problem started a couple of months ago when, returning from the hospital after a routine consult, I heard some serious noises emanating from the rear axle area. I was in fear of being overtaken by my left rear wheel, so took it really easy on the way home (clunk, bang, creek, crash.......), and was hugely relieved to pull in to the shed. An inspection of the raised back end revealed that the left rear wheel bearing had collapsed! I wanted to avoid removing the entire Independent Rear Suspension (IRS) unit, and as I could not find any other cause for the cacophony (the brake calipers seemed to be secure, and there was no movement in the diff), I set about removing and dismantling the rear hubs and carriers. This isn't an easy task when you don't have a press!

Before I had finished taking the carriers apart I ordered all the parts I could think of – there's no point in going to this trouble only to re-install old and used parts. Wheel and fulcrum bearings and races were soon on their way. The hub carriers appear to be undamaged, so what have I forgotten? I should have sufficient spare shims to complete the job...... I have a couple of spare hub spacers for the wheel bearing end float adjustment, so all is well - - NOT!

The fulcrum bearings require a pre-load of 0.01" - 0.02" and this means putting the unit together on the bench with a known excess of shims, measuring the resulting end float, subtracting shims to the value of the end-float plus the pre-load, and re-



assembling, this time with the felt oil seals in place (confused yet?) Anyway, I soon discovered I didn't have enough of these tiny delicate shims to complete the job, so I called Phil at Jag Prestige Spares, thinking I could order them off the shelf and have them in a couple of days courtesy of Australia Post. No such luck! They had to be ordered from England! They finally arrived in Melbourne and were despached to me Express Post on 30th October, only to arrive in Townsville on 19th November! I was not impressed! At least this gave me plenty of time to clean up all the parts and to prepare my workspace.



I finally completed the assembly and fitted the road wheels on Sunday 26th November – the day after our annual Christmas Party – but no time for a test drive. That'll have to wait for tomorrow.

Postscript: The test drive was successful, the unwelcome noises have gone away. Next jobs: fitting new woodwork recently arrived from America; and making up some new door cards. The old ones look ok on the surface, but are badly moisture-damaged.

My existing woodwork itself is ok, it's just the varnish that has gone dull, cloudy and cracked over the years, concealing the original wood grain, as you can see on the photo below. Don't be confused by the camera aspect. These two pieces are identical shapes!




