



Reg enjoyed a short "nanny nap" while we saved him

Wendy and David from the Tablelands, have arranged for local members and other people who are interested in our club to come and meet us all and check out the cars.


This year we will be staying at the Atherton Holiday Park which is situated at 64/72 Mountain View Road. If you want to contact them their phone number is 40 911099.

MEMBERS STORIES

David and Wendy's New Zealand trip

Our holiday in New Zealand went very well. The day after we flew in we were travelling in David's brother John & wife Marcia's 4WD which was trailering the 1935 Morris 8 Roadster while other friends, Peter & Christine White who had come from Sussex U K for the Art Deco Festival in Napier, they drove John's 1939 De Soto from Auckland to Taupo where we all stopped for lunch. From Taupo David drove and I travelled in the De Soto to Napier, on our way the car developed a leak in the top tank above the just rebuilt radiator hence water sprayed out through the grill and onto the windscreen, whilst climbing over the Kaimanua Mountain Range, we managed to get there O K and when David checked the water it had lost about 3 cups. We unloaded the Morris where Peter & Christine White stayed and we stayed at Elma's unit while John & Marcia stayed with relatives. The next morning Elma had to work so she loaned us her mobile phone, we got away early to get to Peter & Christine's unit to follow John to the local Vintage Car Club grounds for morning tea and the starting place for the morning's rally.

Some of the most exotic cars were entered such as a very rare supercharged Squire (1 of 10 built) same owner had a 1949 2.5L Mk5 Drophead Coupe and a 45T Bugatti, all in magnificent condition. No less than 24 Bentlys, V12 Lemans Lagonda 31, Packards etc.

John handed us some dog tags and keys to the De Soto saying it's all yours for the run. They stayed behind to get the Morris ready for the town parade. The observation and time rally went up into the foot hills of Taradale very interesting rally - the car lost a little water but not as much as the day before. We noted all the things we were to see plus our time was quite good but when we read the rules it stated we had to be members of the N Z Vintage Car Club, we couldn't legally enter our results. We drove to Tennyson Street in Napier where we left the De Soto and met up with John who had his Morris 8 in the parade (in amongst over 500 other old cars).

David hadn't driven it before so we had a little fun when he stalled it. A Wurlitzer machine on board a Model T made it difficult to hear if the Morris 8's engine was turning over. Trying this and that we managed to get it going to drive the 3 km parade trip around he main CBD and along Marine Parade where all cars parked for a static display. Later that evening John found the Morris had a flat battery.

We all went to the Art Deco Fashion parade which was held in the Sound Shell - we encouraged Marcia to enter wearing her very nice 1935 suit. There were 17 contestants - Marcia was very nervous - said she felt sick.

They announced the 3rd and 2nd places and called out No 101 as the winner everyone looked around, Marcia had her No card hidden - there was silence before she thought I'd better look at mine to find she was the winner. We (Peter, John, Christine, David and I) woo hued, clapped and whistled - the M C pointed our way asking Marcia if those noisey folk were her rent a mob.

Marcia got a \$50 dollar voucher for a fashion store in Napier. We drove the De Soto back to Elma's as we had made a prior booking to take her out to dinner at the RSA. John, Marcia, Peter and Christine had booked into another venue for that evening. We got dressed in our evening Art Deco gear to go to the RSA - dinner was fabulous along with the live band's music - so good we stayed until 12.15am. The next morning we took Elma for a run in the De Soto to look at some wood carvings that were done using the tree trunks and stumps. We met up with John and co 10.00am at the cart races.

After the races we walked along Marine Parade and beach front to view the Gatsby Picnic spots - some were very high society style High Tea in their gazebos furnished with antique furniture, rugs, flowers and pot plants all guests in colour co ordinate evening wear. On our way back to the De Soto we were approached by a couple who wanted to know what's going on as they explained they had just got off the Cruise ship birthed in the Napier Harbour. I guess it would have looked rather odd as the whole town; buildings, vehicles and people dressed in clothes of the 1930s. There were steam engines,old bicycles, driving up and down Marine Parade along with over 500 cars parked both sides of Marine Parade, many were along the beach. We told them about the Art Deco Festival which is held each year to celebrate the rebuild of Napier after the earthquake nearly demolished the town in 1931.

Elma, David & I had our picnic lunch at the sunk in gardens among the fountains also watched warbirds doing aerobatics and formation displays. The next morning we said our good byes to Elma and met up with John & Co 8.30am at the Motel where Peter & Christine stayed. Shortly after we David & I in the De Soto were on the road heading for Taupo. We stopped there as Peter & Christine took over driving the De Soto to see friends in Hamilton while we visited an Uncle and I drove the 4WD towing the Morris 8 part of the way back to Auckland while John had a cat nap.


