Only fifteen years separates these two particular vehicles, yet the one on the left could almost pass for a current model while Jim Lewis' Mark VII is obviously from a bygone era. Mick Gawalski's XJ6 is a 1969 model making it an early Series I. These were in production from 1968 until 1973 while the basic formula and timeless lines survived in Series II and III guise until 1986. Even after that XJ12s were sold into the early nineties. One has to wonder how many cars GMH would have sold in 1970 if their current model had still been the FJ! While the Mark VII first appeared in 1950, Jim's is actually a VIIM of 1954 vintage. Despite what appears to us now as an old-fashioned shape, the formula survived into the 1960s, the Mark IX ceasing production in 1961. The VII-VIII-IX series have seen a dramatic and well deserved rise in popularity in recent years and Jim's car is a particularly exquisite example. Topical isn't it? To have an economy run at federal budget time I mean. And didn't the interest rate rise among participants when we calculated the final figures at the end of the run. Now if we could just get those pollies to be as frugal with our taxes as we were with the petrol.

Having filled our tanks to the top and set trip metres to zero we set out — four Jags and one Mag. It was great to have the company of that gracious lady, the Mk VIIM of Jim Lewis all the way from Richmond. Jim had called in the previous afternoon while Bill and I were stripping his power steering pump from the Series II (hence the Mag and not the Jag). Jim told us then of his intent to take advantage of his trip to Townsville to join in this event. It's not often we have the chance to meet some of our more far flung members so it was wonderful to spend some time with Jim and Shirley the next day. Jim also took the opportunity to meet up with Clive and Charmaine Hutchison so they could compare XK140 notes which I believe they did at length!

We travelled at a sedate pace to the old Cromarty homestead. We could go no further because the area is so waterlogged that the road is out. The old homestead looks appealing set in a lush and very picturesque setting. Always reminds me of some South American plantation owners home. On arrival at Giru we checked trip metres and found discrepancies up to several kilometres despite having played follow the leader all the way. We settled under an unusual shade tree in the park and enjoyed some very good pies and burgers from the café opposite. We were unable to identify the tree but it was loaded with large fruit that looked somewhat like small cabbages. Soon an eagle-eyed picnicer announced, 'Here comes a white Jag.' 'That will be the Gawalskis', we said. And it was. All four - including the unfortunate asthma sufferer, Bernie, whose illness had delayed their departure. The next arrivals were a contingent from the Burdekin Cruisers in their Mustangs and T-Bird. They showed great interest in the Jags—one of their group owning a Series II XJ6. They told us they were intending

to go to the 'Back to Ravenswood event at the end of the month and wondered if we were going (details of this later).

On the way home we detoured into Pangola Park (which is now closed) to give us a little extra mileage for calculating our economy or lack of it. Then it was back to the servo to top up once more and warm up the calculator. We decided to use the unladen weight of the cars as recorded in books and dispensed with the weighing of passengers for fear of reprisals. Having calculated km per litre we then multiplied by vehicle weight to arrive at the totally meaningless but comparable tonne.km/l figure for each. The results are shown in the table below. Congratulations to Mick and Christine as the first of the Jags. Kevin was sure he should have multiplied by the number of cylinders as well to give the V12 a chance. You will notice there are some very close results. I was a bit miffed at finishing between the Mk VII and the XJS so went home to lean off a couple of carbies even though they didn't appreciate it. • Formula 1 Bits'n'Pieces

- Excerpt from *Motor Sport*'s editor's report on the Melbourne GP: 'The very first thing we see when we step from the Quantas Boeing is a huge hoarding, bearing a picture of the Jaguar R1 and the words "The Cat is Back". Melbourne, it turns out, has been hired by Jaguar for the weekend. The car is everywhere, from billboards by the motorway to billboards on the sides of the city's trams.' Pictures to support the article show a great neon 'JAGUAR' sign covering one wall of a high rise building about twenty floors up and a tram with large back to back leapers.
- the V10 'Jaguarised' Cosworth engine has the best power to weight ratio on the grid 800 horsepower from just 97 kilograms.
- Late on Saturday right before the Melbourne GP the Jaguar mechanics found the answer to a
 mystery that had plagued the engine during testing. Bad winter weather in England had cut testing
 time to nothing and there had not been time to solve the problem of disappearing oil pressure under
 hard cornering. They knew there was a problem with the scavenge pump but eventually they found
 a faulty return valve in the gearbox.
- After every two hours on the track the V10 engine needs a 200 hour overhaul—puts our grumbles about mechanical maladies into perspective doesn't it?
- Consistency was the name of the game at Silverstone and the Spanish GP. Both Jaguars finished about 11th and 12th in both races. Maybe they'll move up a place or two at the Nurburgring viewing time is 11:40 pm on Sunday 21.
