Know Your Club Part 1

We all know our club in its current form as an independent entity **The Jaguar Car Club of North Queensland (Inc.)**, but our history goes back many years before the club was incorporated in its own right.



# jaguar drivers club queensland

The oldest set of minutes in our archive (that I can find), for **The Townsville Register of the Jaguar Drivers Club of Queensland Limited**, dates back as far as 2<sup>nd</sup> February 1987 (but refer back to previous minutes of a meeting on 3<sup>rd</sup> November 1986). They make reference, in Correspondence Inwards, to a letter received from Mr B Groothoff, Secretary to J.D.C.Q, welcoming the new register. I haven't (yet) managed to find a copy of this letter, but it would almost certainly mark the first official recognition of our club as a distinct and separate entity, and would have been received sometime between 3<sup>rd</sup> November 1986 and 2<sup>nd</sup> February 1987.

# TOWNSVILLE REGISTER

It's almost certain that local Jaguar enthusiasts would have been meeting regularly for some time before 1987, informally as well as formally. Merv Potter tells me there had been serious discussion involving him, Bill Honniball and possibly others, about setting up a local Jaguar car club earlier in the 1980s, but this never happened.

The first Management Committee of the new register was comprised of:

Mr Johnny Whipp – Chairman Mr Bill Honnibal\* – Secretary Mrs Joanne Campion – Treasurer

Membership numbered 15, but reference is made to 3 Townsville-based members of the Brisbane Register\*.

It's interesting to note that there was a **Jaguar Enthusiasts Club of Cairns** at this time, but it was not affiliated with JDCQ. Their newsletter was called **The Cat's Whisker**.

From the get-go the Townsville Register attracted a number of members from regional areas such as Cairns, The Tablelands, Mount Isa, Charters Towers etc, resulting in the Townsville Register being formally re-branded, as **The North** *Queensland Register of The Jaguar Drivers Club Queensland*.



By 2008, after many years of co-operation and peaceful co-existence, concerns were being increasingly expressed at the perceived high-handed attitudes from Brisbane towards the regional registers in general and with Townsville/North Queensland in particular, resulting in a resolution being passed at the 2008 AGM to seek independence from the Queensland Club.

**The Jaguar Car Club of North Queensland** was formally incorporated and registered in the first half of 2010, with the first official Members Meeting of the new club being held on 7<sup>th</sup> July 2010, with Reg Fels as the inaugural President.

So, how old is our club? And when is our "birthday?

- November 1986, when we received recognition from JDCQ?
- June 2010, when our incorporation documents were formally stamped by Queensland Government?
- 1<sup>st</sup> July 2010, the start of our first membership year as noted in our Constitution?
- 7<sup>th</sup> July 2010, the date of our first Members Meeting?

#### I'll leave that up to you to decide.

What I DO KNOW however, is that we'll be around for many more years yet.....


Merv: My interest in Jaguars began in 1977.
